Your Cat Wants To Go Home

Cats are often brought in as “found strays” by Good Samaritans. We know that many of these must certainly be beloved pets because of the beautiful collars they wear and their healthy appearance. It is extremely rare for cats who are brought in as strays to be returned to their owner because most are not microchipped. When we scan a microchipped stray cat, we see a code number that corresponds to the owner’s information provided to us so that we can contact you and let you know where your cat is.

Spay & Neuter Your Cat

Medical services for shelter and public animals are provided at Haven Humane Society’s Clinic under the direction of Dr. Cyanna Brauning, Chief Medical Officer.

Haven’s Clinic Staff is dedicated to the humane treatment of animals and supports efforts to expand Spay and Neuter services by holding a monthly Feral Cat Program. Feral cats are brought to the clinic in traps and each cat is tested for disease, vaccinated and spayed/neutered. For more information please call HHS Clinic at 241-1658.

Cats Need Your Help

The HHS Foster Program allows underage and/or underweight animals to go home with a qualified Foster Parent so they can grow large enough to safely undergo spay/neuter surgery.

Mamas with litters or a single baby can go home with you where it is nurtured and cared for until it reaches the required age/weight. It is then returned for surgery and is microchipped so it is ready for adoption to a forever home.
